## Election Procedure*

for the dormitory council of the Studierendenwerk's dormitory at Koblenz

## Paragraphs

## §I Date

(1) The council will be elected every year in November.
(2) A re-election of council members is possible.

## §II Right to vote

(1) Every resident has the right to stand for elections.
(2) Every resident has the right to vote.

## §III Communication

(1) The council will announce the start of the candidacy.
(2) The council will draw attention to the election.
(3) The election results have to be published.

## §IV Election System

(1) Every resident has only one vote by means of a convenient voting system.
(2) If there are no more than nine candidates, a simple yes/no choice will be available.
(3) If there are more than nine candidates there will be an electoral list.

## Details/Explanation

The elections take place every year at the beginning of the winter semester (November). This implies that the legislative period is one year. A re-election is possible.

Every resident of the dormitory with a valid contract has the right to apply as a candidate.

Every resident of the dormitory with a valid contract has the right to vote.

The dormitory's council will send an email to each resident at Studierendenwerk which will announce the start of the candidacy.

Furthermore, an email will be sent out specifying the type and date of elections, and information about every candidate. The latter can also be found in the glass showcase.

The election results must be made public by the Studierendenwerk so that that every resident has the chance to see them.

Several voting systems are possible: by means of ballots sent to every resident's mailbox or by means of online voting.
If there are nine candidates or less, a simple yes/no vote will be issued to support or reject a candidate.

If there are more than nine candidates, a list of all candidates will be written (in a random chronological order). A candidate can be chosen by placing a cross behind his/her name. Therefore, every resident can maximally cross nine boxes. (If more, the ballot is considered invalid.) The nine candidates with the most votes will form the new dormitory's council.
